Best known for her expressive hummingbirds, cardinals, and especially her beloved chickadees, she paints the quiet joys of everyday life and the fleeting beauty of small moments. Each bird carries its own personality—collectors often see themselves, their children, or their memories reflected in the charming expressions she creates.

Jennifer's artistic journey began in childhood with pen and ink, driven by an early fascination with pattern, color, and emotional nuance. Though she took only a few formal classes, she considers herself largely self-taught. Her creative foundation was shaped at home by her father—a watercolorist who painted on silk and a photographer known for striking black-and-white imagery—whose artistic spirit helped nurture her sensitivity to detail and feeling.

While her academic path led her into business, earning a degree in finance and an MBA in management, painting remained her quiet constant. Over the years she refined her technique through personal study, experimentation, and disciplined practice. Today, her work includes not only her signature birds but also miniature landscapes and still lifes, each one crafted with intimacy and intention.

Jennifer paints for the smiles her work brings. Nothing delights her more than watching someone's face light up as they lean in to admire one of her miniatures. Though she also creates larger pieces, it's the tiny paintings—the ones that invite viewers to pause, look closely, and feel a moment of joy—that spark the biggest smiles.

Her paintings have appeared in galleries across Texas and now live in private collections throughout the United States.

Jennifer creates from her sunlit studio in the Texas Hill Country, a peaceful space she shares with her husband, two affectionate Dachshunds, and a rescue cat whose gentle presence mirrors the soulfulness of her work.
